Position Purpose

The girls' lacrosse head coach is a representative of the School who is genuinely passionate about developing Middle School female athletes as individual and team players. The coach creates practice and game environments in which inclusion, teamwork, and skill development are equally valued. The coach balances competitiveness with modeling and expecting sporting behavior. The coach communicates well with student athletes, assistant coaches, officials, opposing teams, parents, and peer athletic staff. As part of the role, the coach must lift sports equipment, will be exposed to varying temperatures and weather, must travel within the Metroplex, and must attend to student athlete safety and security.

- Assume head coach responsibilities for Middle School girls' lacrosse team(s) for spring 2023 season.
- Create and execute practice plans and game strategies; manage equipment.
- Supervise student athletes in accordance with School safety and security protocols.
- Manage team communication.



Provide coaching guidance to assistant coaches.

Qualifications

- Must be 25 years or older.
- Middle School lacrosse coaching experience; preferably experience as a player as well.
- Demonstrate a positive coaching approach and enthusiasm for the sport of lacrosse.
- Ability to build positive relationships with students, staff, and parents; strong oral and written communication skills.
- Clear driving record and ability to drive School vans (standard, valid driver's license; CDL not required).
- Completion of CPR/First Aid certification and four-hour online Praesidium child safety course required upon commitment.

Physical Requirements

- Ability to lift approximately 30 lbs.
- Ability to adjust from sitting to standing with ease; ability to stand for long periods of time.
- Ability to drive School van with student passengers.



- Ability to work with children and adults in indoor and outdoor settings.
- Ability to work in on-campus and off-campus situations.
